What We Did

Our first activation event was at Nashville Speedway back in June, which was also my first Xfinity race of the season.

The response was overwhelming!

The testers we had on-site to conduct Hep C screening were only expecting to test about 5 people over the course of the weekend. On our first day, they tested 82!

Good news, bad news. Because the response was so great, our tester ran out of kits and we had to close the testing down for the weekend.

Consistently securing *certified* testers for each event proved to be our achilles heel in our first year.

But the consistent engagement at each event confirmed to us that the NASCAR audience is receptive to liver disease screening.

As stated earlier, our biggest challenge of the year was securing certified testers to conduct the Hep C screenings in each city. But this is an issue we know we can solve moving forward into 2022.

Other than that, the engagement at our activation booth was so positive we know that our mission is going to make an impact. With the limited amount of events days (20) we did and the number of test days (11/20) conducted, the results were excellent.

351 people tested for Hep C in 11 days and 9 positives (2.5%).

And with a fuller race schedule for 2022, exposure for the foundation and awareness of the Race To End Hep C campaign is sure to increase.

With supporters like you, we are sure to save a lot of lives for years to come.
